

# **CHAPTER FOUR: Township and Tribal Profiles**

## **HOW TO USE THE TOWNSHIP PROFILES**

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In this chapter Yellow Medicine County's 21 townships and the Upper Sioux Community (USC) are profiled. The profiles include information on population, number of households, and income characteristics. The population information presented used the 1970 - 2000 U.S. Census records. This time span is used to help identify historical population change. Household estimates for each township are from 1980 - 2000 and income information is based on reported 1999 incomes. All historical data is from the Minnesota Department of Administration's Datanet and estimated population projections were compiled by the Minnesota State Demographic Center in July 2004 unless otherwise noted. In addition, a land use map is included that depicts the various land uses in each township and the USC.


The purpose of the township and USC profiles is to provide a general background on the demographic and land use changes in these locations. This background can help the County identify trends and needs in each of these locations which will assist decision making processes for new or updated official controls, road projects and services.



- Burton Township's population from 1970 to 2000 decreased 57 percent, or 226 residents.
- The projected population in 2025 for Burton Township is expected to decrease 20 percent, or 35 residents.
- The number of households in Burton Township decreased 16 percent, or 12 households, from 1980 to 2000.
- From 1980 to 2000 the number of persons per household in Burton Township decreased 29 percent.
- The 2000 Burton Township median income of \$34,500 was \$107 higher than Yellow Medicine County's median income of \$34,393 and 27 percent less than Minnesota's median income of \$47,111.




- The projected population in 2025 for Echo Township is expected to decrease 18 percent, or 32 residents.
- The number of households in Echo Township decreased 22 percent, or 20 households, from 1980 to 2000.
- From 1980 to 2000 the number of persons per household in Echo Township decreased 22 percent.
- The 2000 Echo Township median income of \$42,750 was 24 percent higher than Yellow Medicine County's median income of \$34,393 and nine percent less than Minnesota's median income of \$47,111.






























